

# No Cost U.S. EPA Accredited 4-Hour Lead-Based Paint Renovation Refresher/Upgrade Training Course

The Lead-Based Paint Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) program is a federal regulatory program under the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) which became fully effective as of April 22, 2010. The rule applies to residential houses, apartments, and child-occupied facilities such as schools and day-care centers built before 1978 and requires anyone who is paid to perform work that disturbs paint in these types of buildings to be certified\* and follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination.

The rule affects the following trades, including but not limited to;

- Building Contractors (repair and renovator)
- Painters
- Carpenters
- Residential rental property owners/managers and maintenance personnel
- HVAC
- Roofer/Siding Installers
- Plumbers
- Electricians

This program combined with the 8-hour Lead Safe Work Practices (LSWP) course satisfies the training portion of the certification. Two LSWP trainings have been scheduled...August 19<sup>th</sup> in Walton, September 8<sup>th</sup> in Oneonta (please see other fliers).

\*Certification consists of two steps; submission of a Firm Certification Application Form to U.S. EPA, and the completion of a U.S. EPA accredited training program. This program combined with the 8-hour Lead Safe Work Practices course satisfies the training portion of the certification. However, although the training is being provided at no cost to the participants, the other step is not free. The fee that is charged to each business/firm is submitted to the U.S. EPA with the Firm Certification Application form. It is recommended that this step be undertaken prior to the training because of possible delays in processing the certificate due to the number of firms requesting certification.
